

HOW DOES THE MAP PROGRAM COMPARE TO WHAT I'D PAY ATTENDING COLLEGE IN IOWA?

The UNO reduced tuition is close to the rates charged by the University of Iowa, Iowa State and the University of Northern Iowa. With this initiative, UNO competes well on the basis of quality, cost and convenience.

WHAT IS THE VALUE OF THIS PROGRAM?

This tuition variance is very attractive to nonresident students to attend UNO, many of whom tend to stay in Nebraska to live and work, according to studies on migration. In offering this opportunity to metropolitan Iowans, UNO's goal is ultimately about improving education levels and increasing economic growth in the greater Omaha area.

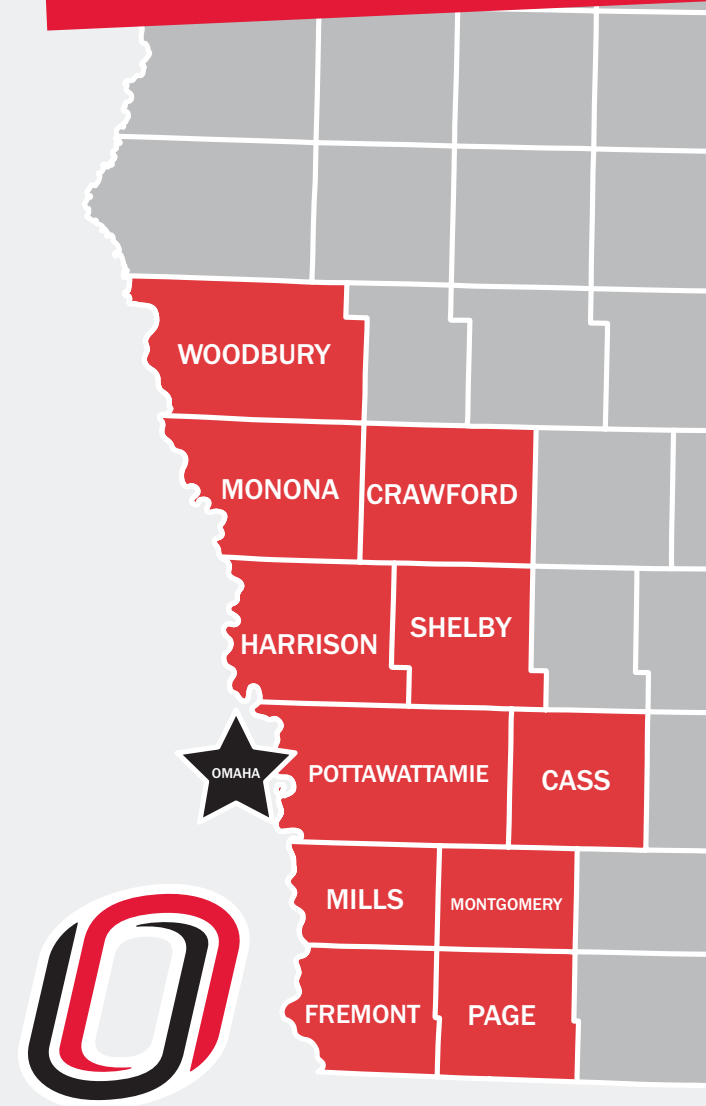
WHAT ABOUT THOSE IOWA STUDENTS WHO EXCEL IN SCHOOL? ARE THERE SCHOLARSHIPS?

Yes. In addition to the new Metropolitan Advantage Program (MAP), UNO also offers Iowa undergraduate students (those seeking their first undergraduate degree) in the eleven county area an opportunity to reduce tuition even further through the Maverick Advantage Scholarship. To qualify for the Maverick Advantage Scholarship, MAP students must present a **23 or higher ACT score** OR rank in the **top 25 percent** of their high school classes. Transfer students must present a 3.0 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.

WHAT IS THE METROPOLITAN ADVANTAGE PROGRAM?

The Metropolitan Advantage Program (MAP) at the University of Nebraska at Omaha offers residents of Cass, Crawford, Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Monona, Montgomery, Page, Pottawattamie, Shelby and Woodbury counties the opportunity to attend UNO undergraduate and graduate programs at a special reduced tuition rate.



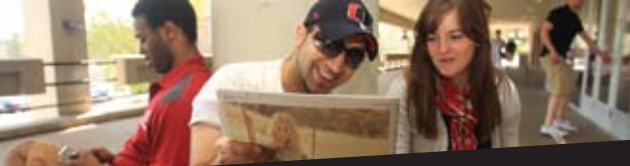
WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE METROPOLITAN ADVANTAGE PROGRAM?

Beginning Fall 2012, eligible students for undergraduate and graduate programs include current residents* of Cass, Crawford, Fremont, Harrison, Mills, Monona, Montgomery, Page, Pottawattamie, Shelby and Woodbury counties and/or graduates of high schools within those counties who meet UNO's admissions requirements. Harrison, Mills and Pottawattamie counties are currently eligible for the Metropolitan Advantage Program.

Students who are currently enrolled at either Iowa Western Community College or Western Iowa Tech Community College and transferring to UNO could also be eligible for the MAP tuition rate. These students must either be a current resident of a MAP county or be a full-time (12 semester hours) student.**

*International students on a visa are not eligible for MAP rates.

**Full-time student must be a direct transfer to UNO, maintaining continuous enrollment between the two institutions.

WHAT DOES IT COST?

Eligible UNO undergraduate and graduate Iowa residents will pay 150 percent of resident tuition.* Tuition costs per credit hour are as follows:
